Online Today helps people with sight loss to get online

A free online basic skills session is being held at Reiver House, Morpeth on **Wednesday 21 June 2017**, **11am – 4pm** to help blind and partially sighted people get online and take their first steps in using technology.

NCBA are supporting the RNIB Online Today program to reach people with sight loss who would like support to get online using the mobile technology of today.

Tablets and smartphones are transforming our everyday lives – and sight loss doesn't have to stop you getting the best out of them.

Online Today can help in many ways, offering support across the UK. From home visits by our volunteers to locally run group sessions, training and one-to-one support. So whatever your technology experience or level of vision, you'll soon be doing things like

browsing websites and sending emails with confidence.

There will be 2 sessions per day, a group presentation in the morning with a light "hands-on-demonstration" and either one to one or small group sessions in the afternoon where you can gain more information or practice using the technology in more detail.

SightPlus – electronic glasses helping people make the most of their remaining sight

The SightPlus headset is a wearable, hands-free and comfortable device that will enhance someone's remaining sight and allow them to recognise text and objects in the distance, read or watch TV comfortably, see faces from across the room or simply sit in the park and watch life come back into focus.

SightPlus™ was designed to offer users with low vision the ability to make the most of their remaining sight.

Significant improvement has been achieved in many users, even those with poor vision. The easy-to-use, wearable and hands-free device allows for TV viewing, hobbies, reading, games and facial/expression recognition.

SightPlus™ combines the company's proprietary software along with existing Augmented / Virtual Reality hardware to provide an off-the-shelf high-tech aid for people living with a range of severe sight impairments.

Acting like a sophisticated wearable magnifier, it helps partially sighted users to achieve clearer vision, both up close and at a distance.

Hexham Pop-in Club (1992 - 2016)

Hexham Pop-in Club has been a longstanding support group for vision impaired people for over 24 years. It was first established in 1992 by Age UK and continuously supported by Northumberland County Blind Association.

In July 1998, the group received £4,350 from the National Lottery and with this they created a booklet of poems called "Picking up Sunshine" which was sold and distributed throughout Tynedale.

During September 2008
"The Yew Tree", a book of poems and thoughts created by vision impaired members, was presented to the Countess of Wessex, Sophie wife of Prince Edward, during her visit to Northumberland County Blind Association.

Jim Clark (club treasurer) stated that, "The group have seen some amazing times and throughout the

years, the club had many members". However, since 2002 the number of members began to decline and particularly within the last year. As a result, the club organisers decided that the December 2016 meeting would be their last.

The club decided that they would celebrate their amazing achievements with a cheerful farewell Christmas meal. Pat White group organiser and Jim Clark (club treasurer) together with the volunteers and members, met to share stories and reminisce about the many exciting activities the group have been involved with over the years.

RNIB Campaigns update

Need it to Read it

All health and adult social care providers in England are now required to provide medical information in a format that blind and partially sighted people can access.

This is thanks to the NHS **England Accessible** Information Standard (also known as SCCI 1605) which mandates that anyone providing a service on behalf of NHS England or in adult social care must provide information in a format that their patients can access. This includes appointment letters, leaflets, letters regarding treatment and conditions as well as the dispensing labels on prescriptions.

If you need your NHS information in an alternative format, or know someone who does, your GP or hospital clinic will need to be officially notified about which format is required.

Talking ATMs

The ability to manage your own finances and remain independent is essential. To support this, RNIB are calling for ATMs in the UK to talk to customers. 'Make Money Talk' campaign has had some real success working with major high street banks to encourage them to make their cash machines, and branches in general, more accessible to blind and partially sighted people.

Currently the following banks provide talking ATMs at most of their branches: Barclays, Lloyds, Halifax, Sainsbury's bank, TSB, Nationwide, Santander.


