Important notice - Transport Costs

As you know we provide a free to use transport service which allows for pick up from home and taken to your location.

This service, we acknowledge, allows you to access much needed services and social interaction etc., however, the funding we received for this has now been depleted and therefore we need to charge for this service for all journeys from the 1st of April 2024.

The transport service will still be available to use but as a PAID for service. This will be charged at a nominal fee of 45p per mile which covers the volunteer's petrol costs <u>only</u> and will be calculated to include return travel from the volunteer's home.

We will invoice service users at the end of every month and payment can be made via cash, cheque, or bank transfer.
