

## Accessibility settings in Windows 11

1. Select the four-square Start button on your taskbar
2. Click the Settings icon (Cog)
3. Click on 'Ease of Access'

### Adjustable features:

- **Text size** - allow you to make text appear larger or smaller.
- **Visual effects** - allows you to turn on or off scrollbars, transparency effects, or animation effects and control how long notifications appear on your screen.
- **Mouse pointer and touch** - change your computer's mouse pointer style or turn your touch indicator on or off.
- **Text cursor** - change the size, colour, and thickness of your text cursor.

- **Magnifier** - used to zoom in on parts of your display. You can turn off and on in this section as well as adjust magnification.
- **Colour filters** - makes colours and photos easier to see adding filters.
- **Contrast theme** - gives you the ability to use more distinct colours to make text and apps on your screen easier to see.
- **Narrator** - screen reader function. See Narrator guide.
- **Audio** - change the volume of your device.
- **Close captions** - can display audio as text. You can also adjust how this is displayed, colour, background, text size etc.
